- 17 Visit the monument **The Hand**, The Fingers, or Man Emerging to Life, a sculpture of five fingers partially submerged in the sand at Playa Brava, Punta del Este.
- **18** Visit the **Piria Castle**, the grand and eccentric residence of Francisco Piria, who founded Piriapolis seaside resort.
- **19** Tour the **Wine Route in Canelones**, where you can visit wineries and vineyards to taste award-winning Uruguayan wines.
- **20** See the **Monumento al Gaucho** in Tacuarembó, an emblematic statue that pays homage to the figure of the gaucho in the Uruguayan culture.
- **21** Visit **"Casa Pueblo" in Punta Ballena**, an impressive architectural construction created by the renowned artist Carlos Páez Vilaró.
- 22 Enjoy fine wines and exquisite culinary pairings while touring the wine cellars in **Carmelo**.
